OUR MISSIONS

1. Sustainable development adapted to the way of life of the populations

Early recovery, resilience and food security. Formal and non-formal education, protection of the environment. Social mobilization and change in behavior through communication and advocacy. Empowerment of communities through the STT (Specific Training Techniques) of the IGA (Income Generating Activities). Promotion and protection of human rights, and in particular those of women and indigenous peoples.

2. Humanitarian

Emergency aid to refugees, displaced persons or affected people. Community development activities: training, information and awareness on the rights and duties of refugees, hygiene and sanitation, gender-based violence, human rights, literacy, STT, IGA.

3. Consolidation of mutual understanding, lasting peace and social cohesion

Advocacy and awareness in the various organization networks, committees and platforms of which we are members. Member of the World Congress of Indigenous Peoples.

OUR STRATEGIC APPROACH

Our actions are developed in the context of the region of the Sahel (Burkina Faso, Mali and Niger), which is characterized by conflict, food and nutritional insecurity, lack of access of communities to resources, the effects of climate change, low level of education and lack of participation of the communities in local governance, particularly with respect to women and children.

The Tin Hinane Association offers alternatives for communities through (i) training, information and outreach to communities, (ii) education, (iii) the recovery of livelihoods, (iv) the popularization of good practices, and (v) the consolidation of community assets while facilitating their access to micro-finance.

Our intervention strategy is to reduce the vulnerability of households and poor communities. It takes into account and promotes internal potential in order to achieve the training and strengthening of the resilience of communities to respond effectively to the structural crisis that affects them.

In accordance with this mission, our association organizes and supports communities through the enhancement of local expertise and livelihoods, without, however, replacing these, in order to enhance their ability to control their work and to ensure the sustainability of the gains. All our projects are participatory and inclusive, including with respect to gender.
